The **STAR** *Program* The Mississippi Economic Council's Student-Teacher Achievement Recognition Program has saluted the academic achievements of the state's outstanding high school students and teachers for 60 years. This year's class joins more than 20,000 top scholars and leading teachers who have qualified for recognition in the STAR program, the most prestigious educational recognition program in the state. STAR Students are seniors with the highest ACT scores (minimum 25) and scholastic averages (minimum 93) in their high schools. They are chosen from more than 300 public, private, and parochial schools. STAR scholarships are provided by the Kelly Gene Cook, Sr. Charitable Foundation. This year, the top ALL-STAR Scholar will receive a four-year \$24,000 scholarship awarded at \$6,000 per year. The first runner-up will receive a four-year \$20,000 scholarship; the second runner-up scholar will receive a four-year \$16,000 scholarship. The STAR Teachers of these top students each will receive a \$1,000 award. Each of the remaining ALL-STAR Scholars will receive a \$1,000 scholarship, with his or her STAR Teacher receiving a \$500 award. The Kelly Gene Cook, Sr. Charitable Foundation gives unselfishly to support the educational endeavors of the Student Teacher Achievement Recognition program. 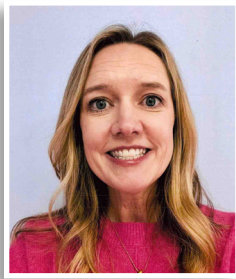

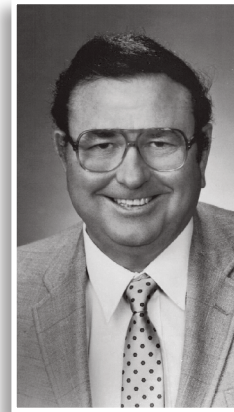

STAR SCHOLARSHIP SPONSOR KELLY GENE COOK, SR. CHARITABLE FOUNDATION, INC.

Kelly Gene Cook, Sr., was born in 1930 in French Camp, Mississippi. He graduated from Mississippi State University with a degree in Civil Engineering. Mr. Cook was a pipeline for more than three decades. He joined Houston Contracting Company in 1956 and became vice president and general manager for domestic and foreign operations in 1971. In this capacity, he dealt with pipelines throughout the Middle East, Brazil, Trinidad, Ecuador, and Nigeria. In 1976, he and a partner formed Gregory & Cook, Inc., a pipeline contracting firm in Houston, Texas. Mr. Cook was active in the industry associations, serving on the boards of the International Pipeline Contractors Association and the American Pipeline Contractors Association. In 1986, Mr. Cook and his wife, Peggy, formed the Kelly Gene Cook, Sr. Charitable Foundation, Inc. The Foundation primarily provides funds to support religious, charitable, scientific, and educational organizations in Mississippi, Louisiana, and Texas. Mr. Cook died on November 27, 1989. Since 1997 the Cook Foundation has provided more than two million dollars in STAR scholarships and awards.

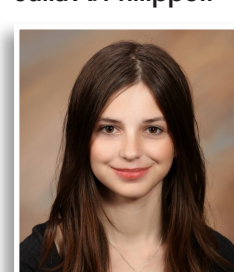

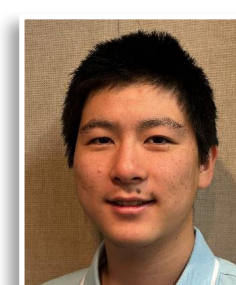

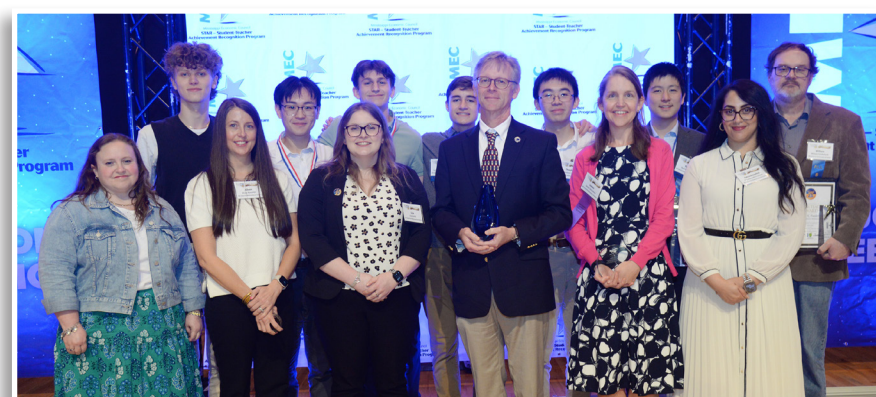

BOB PITTMAN EXCELLENCE IN LEADERSHIP AWARD

Lewis Whitfield is senior consultant of CREATE Foundation. He retired from a 32-year banking career in 2004, having served as president of four banks in Tupelo. He has served as chairman of the board for the MEC, Community Development Foundation, Good Samaritan Health Services, All Saints Episcopal Church, Yocona Area Council of Boy Scouts of America, CREATE Foundation, the Tupelo Symphony Orchestra, United Methodist Senior Services - Tupelo Area, Inc., North Mississippi Health Services, and Good Samaritan Free Clinic. He is a founder and past president of the Association of Excellence in Education and past president of Tupelo Rotary Club. Whitfield was named Tupelo's Outstanding Citizen in 2000 and the Jack Reed, Sr. Community Leadership Award in 2024. Whitfield received B.S. and M.B.A. degrees from Mississippi State. He is a graduate of the School of Banking of the South at L.S.U. He served as an army intelligence officer, a management consultant with KPMG, and a U.S. Senate aide. In addition, Whitfield has served as a member on the following boards: MSU Development Foundation, MSU Alumni Foundation, United Way of Northeast Mississippi, Community Federal Bancorp, Inc., First Bank Capital Corporation, MidSouth Corporation and Journal Publishing Company.
